Study in Germany

As a country that prides on a modern and globally valued medical system, Germany is committed to having the best medical schools in the world to maintain its reputation. So when deciding to enroll a medical degree in

Germany you must expect tougher competition. As such, start preparing from now by getting to know how good you have to be and how much you'll need in your bank account to be able to attend a medical course in Germany.



How many years does it take to get an MBBS in Germany?

In Germany, a regular MBBS course lasts for 6 years and 3 months. But since MBBS courses in are taught in the German language those who don't have the proper level of German have to spend an additional year into a language preparatory course before entering the regular course. Thus, an MBBS in Germany may take up to 7 years and 3 months.

An MBBS in Germany covers four main stages:

Stage 1 (2 years or 4 semesters) – Pre-clinical section

During this stage, you're going to be introduced to major important concepts and topics in medicine like the basics of human anatomy required for further improvement in medicine. At the end of this stage, you'll sit at the first examination test in your MBBS degree course known as the Examination for Physicians or Ärztliche Prüfung.

Stage 2 (3 years or 6 semesters) – Clinical stage

The clinical-stage lasts for 3 years from the 5th semesters in your medical course and it leads to the second round of the Physicians' examination test. This section is the most important part of your medical studies in Germany because you will be taught about core concepts and topics in medicine while you will also participate in plenty of times in hospital environments.

Stage 4 State Examination and Approbation

State examination and Approbation are the final steps to become a recognized medical practitioner in Germany. You're going to sit for a State examination once you have successfully completed your MBBS course. Its intention is to prove you have acquired the required theoretical and practical skills to perform as a doctor. Finally, you have to get a license to be allowed to practice your job as a doctor. Such a license is called Approbation or Berufserlaubnis in the German language, and it's legitimate for the whole of your life.

What if I have a foreign medical degree?

You can work as a doctor in Germany even if you have attained your medical education in a foreign country. But there are some procedures you have to go through for your academic qualifications to be evaluated according to the German qualifications' framework. If German authorities assess your medical education as equivalent to what is required in Germany they will issue to you the Berufserlaubnis and you can practice your job as a doctor all across the country.

In addition to allowing you to work as a doctor, an Approbation or Berufserlaubnis enables you to specialize in a chosen medical field. At the end of your education, you'll be awarded a medical specialist title known as "Facharzt".

Note that if you find a medical job in Germany for a limited period of time you can get a temporary medical license that lasts for two years.

Language requirement

As a doctor, you're going to have constant engagement with patients and therefore excellent communication skills are a necessity. This being said, to get your medical license in Germany you have to prove your German language proficiency. Though a B2 level is mainly accepted, the language requirement for getting your Approbation in Germany varies among federal states.

Prerequisites and Requirements to apply for an MBBS in Germany?

The German medical universities are among the best in the world and because of it are highly competitive. To get a place on an MBBS course you have to show an excellent level of knowledge from a wide variety of topics and subjects related to medicine.

Prerequisites to get admitted at these courses also include personal skills, having to do with the ability to handle the pressure, communication skills, cognitive and critical thinking abilities, and so on.

> The most important requirement to study in Germany is getting your German student visa.

The MBBSs in Germany are highly intense programs, containing around 20 to over 30 hours of compulsory classes within a week, examinations often come and apply high standards, and also cover a wide range of topics. As such, you need to show a high level of commitment to withstand its pressure.

The requirements to apply for an MBBS degree course in Germany may vary according to several factors like your chosen university or the federal state where that university is located.

Also, your previous education may play a significant role in the application process. If you hold a high school certificate issued in a non-EU country you have to take a preparatory course and sit for an examination test before starting the regular course. On the other hand, qualifications conferred in Europe are admitted without needing a further examination.

Though to a certain limit, the entry requirements change from a medical university to the other, to apply for an MBBS in Germany you will need the following documents:

High school certificate – recognized as equivalent to German qualifications if you're a citizen of a non-EU and non-EEA country.

Grades from previous education – you must have higher grades in particular subjects related to medicine like chemistry and biology.

German Language proficiency – Because all MBBS degree courses in Germany are taught in German. There are several standardized German language tests you can get. One of them is TestDaf or Deutsch als Fremdsprache. Most German medical universities require a Level 4 in all TestDaf sections at the minimum. Other German proficiency tests accepted at German medical schools are Deutsche Sprachprüfung für den Hochschulzugang (DSH), Goethe Certificate, Kleines Deutsches Sprachdiplom (KDS), Großes Deutsches Sprachdiplom (GDS).

Additional examination tests– Some medical schools may also require you to undergo specific examination tests in order to precisely evaluate your strength point at particular study areas and your suitability for their MBBS course. Commonly, TestAS or Test for Medical Studies may be required for this purpose.

Note that your knowledge of the Latin language is not an application requirement, but it can be taken into consideration.

How much does an MBBS in Germany cost?

German universities don't carry tuition fees, but there are still some administrative fees you need to pay. Taking into consideration the student union fee and public transport ticket the amount of money you must pay during a semester ranges from €150 to €300 at maximum.

On the other hand, there are living costs in Germany that you need to take care of. Fortunately, Germany isn't that expensive to live in compared to other EU countries. Whatsoever, regarding the quality of medical education you'll receive and future prospects it promises an MBBS in Germany is worth every single cent.
