MSc Nursing in the UK or Masters of Nursing is available in 80+ universities and colleges. It is designed as an 1-3 year program depending on the chosen field of

specialisation, the mode of study, and the institution. Studying MSc Nursing in the UK will cost between 17,000 GBP to 23,000 GBP per year, as the tuition fees.

MSc in Nursing in the UK allows you an opportunity to work under NHS (United Kingdom National Health Services), and the starting salaries for graduates are from Band 5 (24,000 to 30,000 GBP) to Band 7 (37,000 to 72,000 GBP). You can indulge in careers like nurse team managers and nurse consultants that offer handsome salaries and promotions to higher band roles.

Otherwise stated, all the programs listed above are full-time. Although some schools like the University of Salford offer part-time master's program in nursing which spans up to three years.

Why pursue MSc in Nursing in UK?

- 94.2% of nursing graduates were employed. 87% were working as nurses and 9% were working as midwives.
- All the top ten universities in the UK offering Masters in Nursing also offer scholarships to international students.
- The social care sector in the UK employs 1.48 million people with a greater percent being nurses and the sector will have half a million extra jobs available by 2030.

MSc in Nursing in UK Admissions 2023

International applicants who wish to pursue a master's program in core nursing or any of its fields of specialization in the UK are required to meet some of the general admission criteria. These criteria vary slightly across different institutions but nonetheless, most criteria are similar across the board. The details of the admission processes are explained in the section below

MSc in Nursing in UK Eligibility

Applicants interested in pursuing a master's degree in Nursing in the UK must meet the following general eligibility:

- Bachelor's degree in nursing or healthcare-related fields with a grade point of 55% (equivalent to UK's second class lower).
- Other institutions require applicants to possess 75% and above (equivalent to UK's first-class or second-class upper honours) from a recognized institution in the world.

Applicants for MSc in nursing in the UK are required to submit the following document for admission consideration:

- 1. First Degree Certificate: The UG degree acquired in a relevant area of subjects.
- 2. Transcript: Transcripts of UG and standard XII.
- 3. Other documents: Documents that are also required by these universities are:
 - 1. Proof of registration as a registered nurse,
 - 2. Proof of experience,
 - 3. Recommendation letter,
 - 4. Statement of intent,
 - 5. A motivation letter is also called a statement of purpose or motivational statement



For students who need to improve their English before the start of their academic program, the University's English Language Teaching Centre provides long- and short-term English preparation programs.

MSc in Nursing in UK Cost of Study

International Masters applicants interested in studying in the UK must have sufficient funds which are distributed into three categories- the pre-arrival cost, the cost of study and the cost of living. It costs an average of 17,000 GBP - 65,000 GBP to study a master's program in nursing in the UK.

The post-arrival costs will include the tuition fees for studying MSc in nursing in UK and the cost of living in UK. Given below is an image comparing the overall cost involved while pursuing MSc in Nursing in UK:



Tuition fees for Overseas (non-EU) students increase by no more than 5% per year for the length of study. Thus, applicants are advised to factor this into their budget while making a financial plan for a master's program.

As per the graph, it can be concluded that the University of Sunderland has the highest cost and the University of Salford has the lowest. The range of these expenses lies between 21,754 to 47,708 GBP. For an Indian student, this will mean an overall cost of around 20 to 44 Lakhs. If the cost seems too much to cater to, you can apply for the scholarships available to study in the UK.

MSc in Nursing in the UK with Scholarships

The UK Government has announced that nursing, midwifery, and many allied health students will benefit from guaranteed, additional support of at least 5,000 GBP a year. The funding will be available from next year and will not have to be repaid. In Addition to this, other scholarships available to international students in the UK are presented in the table below.
